Lewis & Clark Interpretive Center Returns to Summer Hours for its 20th Season

Washburn, N.D.—Beginning April 17, the Lewis & Clark Interpretive Center and Fort Mandan will be open on Sundays for the summer season, both facilities will be open 9 am - 5 pm daily. The Center and Fort Mandan celebrate their 20th anniversary this year with free admission for all students and a host of new opportunities for children to enjoy. The free admissions are sponsored by MDU Resources and the Lewis & Clark Fort Mandan Foundation.

The Center offers world-class exhibits on the Lewis and Clark Expedition and other aspects of Northern Plains history. New this year are the Young Explorers Knapsacks, a scavenger hunt with which kids can use the tools of Lewis and Clark to explore the exhibits on a whole other level, as well as a variety of sports, games, and more that bring history to life.

Fort Mandan offers a newly-enhanced Young Explorers Play and Discovery Area as well as regular tours by trained guides. The fort is filled with a variety of new replicas made possible with funding from the Northern Plains Heritage Foundation and the Lewis & Clark Fort Mandan Foundation.

Events this summer include Explorer Days, an annual living history event, on June 3 and 4; Music in Harmony Park, a family-friendly evening of concerts, vendors, and more on July 14; and the Lewis & Clark Farmers Market every Friday evening from July 14 to October 27. Art exhibits include *Brush Scholar: The Lewis & Clark Art of Michael Haynes* through June 25, *The Northern Plains National Heritage Area Suite* through October 31, and *Hometown Retrospective: Washburn Art Through the Years* from July 14 through November 30.

The interpretive center is also open during the winter season from October to April on Mondays through Saturdays. On April 1 the facilities will be closed for an annual all-staff training.

The Lewis & Clark Interpretive Center is located 40 miles north of Bismarck at the intersection of US 83 and ND 200A in Washburn.
