Park Entrance Fees

All vehicles must display a valid park entrance permit year-round.

Purchase of annual vehicle entrance permit is available online at www.parkrec.nd.gov; at NDPRD headquarters in Bismarck; or at any state park.

Senior Discount: ND residents 65 and older are eligible to purchase an annual entrance permit for \$20.

Disabled Veterans & POWs: ND veterans with a 100% service-related disability and former POWs are eligible for a free annual permit. All other ND veterans with service-related disabilities may purchase an annual permit for \$20. Requires VA proof of disability or ND DAV/POW license plates.

Library Loan Program: A daily park pass can be checked out by library card holders for no charge at these select Central Dakota Library Network public - Bismarck, Beulah, Garrison, Hazen, Max, McLean/Mercer, Mandan/Morton, Stanton, Turtle Lake, Underwood, Washburn.

Camping Fees

Camping fees do not include entrance fees. A daily or annual permit is required in addition to the following fees. Limited services are available in the off-season. At most parks, the full services season runs from mid-May to mid or late September.

Miscellaneous Fees

Horses: Horseback riding is allowed at Ft. Ransom, Ft. Abraham Lincoln, Sully Creek and Little Missouri. A per horse fee is charged, allowing use of corrals and trails. Use of certified weed-seed-free forage or feed is required. Contact park for availability of certified forage.

Per horse \$6/day

Canoes and kayaks: Available for rent at Lake Metigoshe, Ft. Ransom, Cross Ranch (canoes only) and Ft. Stevenson. Additional fee for drop-off or pick-up service. Minimum 2-hour rental period. A \$50 deposit is required for each canoe rented.

Per canoe or kayak\$16/2 hours or \$50/day

Winter Gear: Cross country ski equipment (including skis, boots and poles) or snowshoes may be rented at Lake Metigoshe and Cross Ranch.

Ski equipment or snowshoes \$15/day

Showers: A \$5 shower permit is required for each person entering the park whose sole purpose is to use the park's shower facility. This applies to non-coin operated shower facilities. Coin operated shower facilities do not require a shower permit.

Seasonal Cabins

Camping Cabins: Small one room cabins are available during the full-service season at the following state parks. Each can sleep up to five in bunk beds, and is equipped with lights, heat, air conditioning, fan and either a deck or patio. No cooking is allowed inside, no showers, sink or toilet. Users must provide their own bedding and towels.

Woodland Cabins: Available during the full-service season at Turtle River State Park. Duplexes sleep 3 to 6. Two of twelve units are wheelchair accessible. All units equipped with private showers and toilets.

Year-round Cabins/Yurts

Log Cabins/Yurts: Available year-round at Cross Ranch State Park and at Lake Metigoshe State Park. Users should bring their own bedding and towels. See park listing for cabin/yurt amenities.



Family Cabins: Available at Lake Metigoshe State Park and Fort Stevenson State Park. Each is equipped with kitchenette, wheelchair accessible bathroom, heat, and gas fireplace. Users are responsible for bedding, towels and soap.

Group Dorms: Two group dorms, each sleep 60 in bunk beds, are available at Lake Metigoshe State Park. Shower house adjacent. Available year round.

Arthur A. Link Centennial Log Cabin is available year-round and sleeps up to 6. No towels, bedding, cooking utensils or dishes provided. Cabin heated with two wood stoves. No running water or inside toilet, but shower facilities are available year-round at the Visitor Center.

Colter Log Cabin is available year-round and sleeps up to 5. It has two bedrooms, electric heat, overhead lights and wood burning stove. Users provide their own camp stove and cooking utensils.

Yurts: Available year-round, the two yurts in the campground sleep up to 6. Both have a refrigerator, gas heating, a table, and a picnic table outside. There is a hike-in yurt located about 4 miles from the main campground, accessible only by hiking, skiing or snowshoeing. It sleeps up to 4 people and includes a wood burning stove for heat, propane lanterns for light, and a nearby vault toilet. There is no electricity or running water in this yurt.

General Guidelines

Policies governing use of North Dakota State Parks are published in the North Dakota Administrative Code, Chapter 58-02-08. The full text is available at www.parkrec.nd.gov and is also posted on campground bulletin boards. Failure to obey these rules may result in verbal or written warning, summons and complaint, fine and/or loss of park privileges.

- Additional information about facility use policies is available either online or at the park.
- Camping allowed on designated campsites only. Only one camping unit per campsite (maximum of 6 people or immediate family), unless the site is designated as a group or multiple site.
- Cabin reservations for campsites, cabins and yurts must be made either through the online management system (www.parkrec.nd.gov) or by calling 800-807-4723. Reservations for picnic shelters, dorms, group and meeting facilities must be made by calling the park directly.
- Reservations for cabins, shelters and group facilities are accepted 1 year in advance. Reservations for campsites are accepted 95 days in advance. A credit card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover) is needed to make a reservation, and the credit card is charged at the time the reservation is made.
- A non-refundable reservation fee is charged regardless of how the reservation is made.
- Reservation cancellation and change fees are charged on a sliding scale. See web site for additional information.
- Cabin and group facility users are expected to do general cleaning prior to vacating, including sweeping, wiping down surfaces and collecting and bagging trash.
- On holiday and special event weekends, a minimum of 2-3 nights rental may be required for cabins.
- Full-service cabin check-in is after 4 p.m. Check-out is 11 a.m.
- Camping cabin check-in is after 4 p.m. Check-out is 1 p.m. (11 a.m. at the Lake Metigoshe Cormorant Cabin).
- Cabin and dorm visitors must provide their own bedding, towels and soap.
- Campsite and cabin occupancy is limited to no more than 14 days in any 30-day period.
- Must be 18 years of age or older to rent park campsites and facilities.
- Fires must be contained in designated fire rings and attended by an adult at all times. Campfires may be prohibited based on rangeland fire dangers.
- No pets allowed inside cabins or indoor facilities.
- Pets must be kept on a leash and attended at all times.
- Pet waste must be bagged and disposed of in an appropriate manner.
- No smoking.
- No game or fish cleaning in or around cabins or group facilities. Contact staff for other arrangements.
- Users must adhere to all park rules and regulations posted in each facility.
- Contact park for restrictions on alcohol use and insurance requirements for rental of group facilities or shelters.
- Use of fireworks is prohibited.
- Metal detecting on state park property is not allowed.
- No person may possess a firearm within a state park, unless it is unloaded and stored in a gun case. Discharging any type of weapon or projectile within a state park is not permitted.
