- > 16 years of age or older

by performing general labor and grounds keeping, assisting in trail upkeep and operating maintenance equipment. Enjoy working to showcase the beauty of the North Dakota outdoors and maintain the integrity of state parks.

NATURAL RESOURCES TECHNICIAN

- > 18 years of age or older, requires 2 years ATV experience
- > Natural Resources, Horticulture, Landscaping

Maintain the natural resources of the state parks

by performing tree maintenance, tree planting, applying herbicides, and maintaining spraying records. Use your passion for the outdoors to help maintain the beauty of our state parks by working as a natural resources technician.

OUTDOOR EDUCATOR/ NATURALIST

- > Requires high school diploma or GED
- > Natural Resources, Education, History

Engage, educate and evoke the curiosity of all visitors

to the various natural, cultural, recreational and historical resources in the park. Create and deliver interactive, hands-on programs or tours utilizing museums, outdoor amphitheaters, visitor centers, special events, recreational trails and educational materials.

PARK RANGER

- > 18 years of age or older, Requires high school diploma or GED
- > Law Enforcement, Forestry, Park Management

CUSTODIAN

- > 16 years of age or older

of your favorite state park as a custodian! Operate tools or equipment to make minor repairs, and maintain stocked supplies for our customers in all facilities of the park to provide a positive experience for our visitors.
